The City of Irving Housing and Human Services Department anticipates receiving FY2008-2009 Department and Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding for projects and activities benefiting low to moderate income persons. The amounts of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, HOME Investment Partnership funds, American Dream Down Payment Initiative (ADDI) and Emergency Shelter Grant (ESG) funds to be allocated from HUD to the City of Irving will be forthcoming.

Those organizations interested in receiving CDBG, HOME and/or ESG for human services activities must be represented at a **mandatory application workshop** on Wednesday February 20, 2008 from 9:00 am to 11:00 am. The workshop will be held at the Valley View Municipal Complex, 333 Valley View Lane, Irving, Texas 75060.

Applications for FY 2008-2009 CDBG, ESG, and HOME funding from the City of Irving will be available as of Monday, January 24, 2008 for activities and projects benefiting low to moderate persons residing in the City of Irving. Crisis Assistance Programs for Low Income Families  
Services for Youth  
Services for the Elderly and Disabled
  
- 3) **Homelessness Services**                      Activities Directly Assisting the Homeless, such as:  
Operations and Maintenance of Emergency Shelters  
Essential Services for the Homeless (direct services to persons)  
Homelessness Prevention Activities
  
- 4) **Non Housing Community Development**              Neighborhood Revitalization Projects  
Infrastructure/Park Improvements
